Urban transport has an impact on a wide range of issues beyond mobility, such as justice, security and equality as well as climate change and finite natural resources. While challenges, needs and opportunities vary from city to city, research has an important task to investigate, influence and draw conclusions from these stories across the world. With this in mind, the Volvo Research and Educational Foundations (VREF) initiates and supports research and educational activities under a programme called the *Future Urban Transport Programme* (FUT), with the overarching vision of promoting fair access and sustainable transport in cities. The FUT programme has focused on the question of how cities and transport providers can deal with the complex issues of urban transport, which is at the interface between technology and social science.

After ten years and 27 million Euro of investment in research and educational activities, eight Centres of Excellence had been established globally, and VREF decided to summarize the results and findings of the FUT Programme. A project team was established under the leadership of Associate Professor *Marie Thynell* at Gothenburg University to summarise the output of the programme. The 10 years with the FUT Programme project has included interviews with all the Centres and a review of publications. The work is presented in this booklet, edited by British author and broadcaster *Christian Wolmar*, together with Marie Thynell.

The booklet sets out selected research results for the first ten years of the Future of Urban Transport under six themes:

Policy and Planning
Management and Control
Public Transport
Rapidly Changing Cities
Walking and Cycling
Traffic Safety
